WHEREAS, the District held a public hearing on its proposed annual budget for fiscal year 2012 on December 13, 2011, at 6:00 p.m., and provided notice of the public hearing as required by law; and

WHEREAS, the adoption of this resolution has been duly noticed in accordance with the Utah Open and Public Meetings Act, and Utah Code Ann. § 17B-1-609(1).

NOW, THEREFORE, the Administrative Control Board of the Sanitation District, resolves as follows:

- The District hereby adopts an annual budget for fiscal year 2012, as more 1. specifically described in Attachment A to this Resolution.
- The District further declares that this budget provides for payment of debt, bond debt service, if any, including transfers for appropriate fund balances, and that said debt service payments exclude payments from any proceeds of Tax Anticipation Notes or borrowing, consistent with Treasury Department regulations.
- This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its approval and adoption by 3. the District and will be filed and recorded in the official minutes and records of the District for this meeting.

Background. The Special Service District #1 was created in 1977 by Salt Lake County to provide household waste collection services to the unincorporated areas of Salt Lake County and the cities of Taylorsville, Herriman, Holladay, Cottonwood Heights and a portion of Murray City. All administrative support and functions for the District are provided by Salt Lake County. The Administrative Control Board was created by the Salt Lake County Council by County Resolution 4345 to be effective January 1, 2010. The Board is a legal subdivision of the State of Utah. All administrative support to the Board shall be provided by the Salt Lake County Sanitation Division. The District operates as an enterprise fund for which a fee is charged to users for services.
